## Key Concepts

Rites of passage, milestones and the journey of life
Birth ceremonies in Christianity, Islam and Hinduism - baptism and naming ceremonies
Initiation into faiths as an adult - confirmation, sacred thread ceremony in Hinduism
Marriage ceremonies - Christian and Hindu weddings
(dependent on class vulnerability) End of life rituals and beliefs

## Key Festivals

Baptism - welcoming babies and children to church, the mandir and the mosque. Origins of baptism (John the Baptist and Jesus)
Decision making as a young adult -
confirmation, adult baptism, bar/bat
mitzvah, Khalsa ceremony, sacred thread
ceremony
Marriage - Christian symbols,
Hindu rituals

## Key Facts

Life is a journey which we mark with various milestones
Rites of passage are key moments in life when life changes direction and decisions need to be made
People of faith have special rites of passage which they share with their community
John the Baptist first introduced baptism as a symbolic new start in life Jesus was baptised in the River Jordan by John
Children and adults can be baptised, joining their faith community.
Hindus and Muslims have naming ceremonies for babies.
Confirmation marks a young adult deciding to join their church.
Hindus have sixteen samskaras (rites) during childhood- the last being the sacred thread
Marriage marks the beginning of a new phase in an adult's life. Most religious people believe that this life is just one stage.

## Key Vocabulary

Journey - an act of travelling
Rite of passage - ceremony or event of an important stage of life

## Baptism

Font - a container in a church that holds water
Confirmation - A ceremony in which someone is confirmed into the Christian Church
Sacred thread ceremony- A Hindu ritual primarily for boys to rebirth into the world.
