Festivals



Key Festivals

Shabbat - Jewish day of rest

Bar or Bat Mitzvah - Jewish rite of passage

Pesach - Jewish festival of Passover

Lent - forty days of fasting leading up to Easter

Easter - Christian festival remembering the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ

Ascension - Christian festival remembering Jesus' ascent to heaven on Whit(e) Sunday

Pentecost - the start of the Christian church when the disciples came to Jerusalem to teach for the first time.

Key Dates

Palm Sunday - start of Easter week when Jesus entered Jerusalem for the Jewish Passover Maundy Thursday- Jesus celebrates the Passover with his Last Supper and is arrested Good Friday - the crucifixion of Jesus Easter Sunday - the resurrection of Jesus Ascension Day (Whitsun) - Six weeks after Jesus' resurrection
Pentecost - the founding of the Christian

church seven Sundays after Easter.

Key Facts

Palm crosses are made in churches on Palm Sunday.

Maundy Thursday is the day of Jesus' Last Supper which is remembered every week in churches as Holy Communion or Mass.

Bread and wine are the symbolic foods at Mass that recall Jesus' final commands to his disciples.

Jewish priests had Jesus arrested but the Roman government ordered his execution.

Jesus lay in the tomb till Sunday as Shabbat had started and there was no one to tend to his body till it was over.

Easter Eggs are a symbol of new life.

Christians believe that Jesus resurrected and remained with his disciples for six weeks to teach them.
