Key Facts

Heroes are people who do something brave but role models are people who inspire others to be better people.

Jesus was baptised in the River Jordan by his cousin John.

Baptism is all about starting a new life.

Christians believe Jesus was tempted to use his powers from God to help himself not others.

Temptation leads to two choices - succumb or resist!

Our conscience helps us to make choices.

Parables are stories Jesus told to help explain how to live a good life and, Christians believe, what God intends for people to do. The Beatitudes are the eight guidelines that Jesus taught in the Sermon on the Mount.

Key Vocabulary

Role Model: A person who someone admires

Hero: Someone who is admired for having done something very brave or achieving something great

Temptation: A wish to do or have something that you know you should not do or have

Succumb: To lose the determination to oppose something. To accept defeat.

Parable: A story that has a meaning which we can learn from

Miracles: An unusual event that is thought to have been caused by God.
