Key People

- **David Hockney:** A British painter, printmaker and photographer. One of the most influential British artists of the 20th century and contributor to the pop art movement in the 1960s.
- **Paula Rego:** A Portuguese-born artist who is known for her paintings and prints based on storybooks.
- **Pieter Brueghel:** An artist from Belgium, known for painting sweeping landscapes and peasant scenes.
- **Edward Hopper** An American realist painter and printmaker.
- **Fiona Rae:** A modern, British artist, born in Hong Kong.

Key Vocabulary

- **Abstract:** Modern art which has colours, lines and shapes but does not represent objects or living things.
- **Narrative:** A story.
- **Pop Art:** An art movement which began in the 1950s. It is a style which is based on simple, bold images of everyday items.
- **Preparatory drawing:** A sketch or an initial plan.
- **Re-enact:** To repeat the actions of an event that has happened.
