- David Hockney: A British painter, printmaker and photographer. One of the most influential British artists of the 20<sup>th</sup> century and contributor to the pop art movement if the 1960s.
- Paula Rego: A Portuguese-born artist who is known for her paintings and prints based on storybooks.
- Pieter Brueghel: An artist from Belgium, known for painting sweeping landscapes and peasant scenes.
- Edward Hopper An American realistpainter and printmaker.
- **Fiona Rae**: A modern, British artist, born in Hong Kong.

## Key Vocabulary

- Abstract: Modern art which has colours, lines and shapes but does not represent objects or living things.
- Narrative: A story.
- **Pop Art:** An art movement which began in the 1950s. It is a style which is based on simple, bold images of everyday items.
- **Preparatory drawing:** A sketch or an initial plan.
- Re-enact: To repeat the actions of an event that has happened.


